

Charity News



9/11 Blood Drive

Tuesday 9/11 at Fire Station #44 at Morse & Pinellas Blvd. is the next blood drive in memory of the heroes and victims of the attacks on 9/11/2001.

Club members who donate or volunteer will be in a drawing for a free golf cart service from the Villages Golf Cart. Every one who gives blood will get discount meal coupons for Amerikano's & Havana CC. BOGO free breakfast entrees and a free milk shake coupon at Johnny Rockets, free movie tickets and a Pint for a Pint draft beer coupon.



So far in 2018, the Club's blood drives have produced 460 pints of blood or 57.7 gallons and can save the lives of 1,380 people. The goal for this year is 100 gallons.



Profile of Deliver The Difference

Deliver The Difference is one of the charities the Club donates to. Last year this charity distributed 1.4 million meals through weekend and summer KidPacks programs, local food pantries and hunger relief organizations in Lake Sumter and Marion Counties. The meals are packaged by volunteers and the Club provides enough members to fill a packing line when they hold a food packing party at one of the recreation centers in The Villages. Each meal cost 30 cents and is designed by food scientists to provide all the protein, minerals and vitamins necessary to stop and reverse the effects of malnutrition. The Club has designated that all proceeds from the 50/50 be donated to Deliver The Difference. That means every time you buy \$5 worth of 50/50 tickets at a Phlocking, you're also donating 8 meals to hungry people.



Christian Food Pantry

The Club collects food for the Christian Food Pantry in Lady Lake at every Phlocking. **During the summer months the need is greater because kids don't get school lunches. Please be generous.**

Member Interview

This month's Parrot Head Profile features Glennie Kinder. You may have seen her smiling face at the popular Phins Up Shop that is set up at all of the Phlockings.

Glennie and Paul have lived in the Village of Sabal Chase since 2006. They were originally looking at two homes in Mallory that were sold before they could put in an offer. As luck would

have it, both those houses were lost in the tornado that came through The Villages in 2007 so they were very happy they bought their home in Sabal Chase!

They were introduced to the Parrot Head Club in May 2006 when they were purchasing their home. They moved down in July and by August they were members and haven't looked back since.

Aside from the two movie clubs that Paul runs, The Old Cowboy Movie Club, and the WWII Movie Club, the Parrot Head Club gets most of their time. 
